

## Is wonder woman on netflix australia 2020

When Wonder Woman 1984 opened in cinemas Down Under at the end of 2020, it was the year's last big release. The superhero sequel was one of the very few blockbuster flicks to actually hit the silver screen since the pandemic started, too. Now, just over a month later, the Gal Gadot-starring film is doing something else notable: becoming available via video on demand while it's still showing in theatres. From Wednesday, January 27, cinephiles and caped crusader fans can stream Wonder Woman 1984 via digital movie rental services such as Google Play, YouTube Movies, Amazon Video and iTunes — to rent for AUD\$34.99. If you'd prefer to see it on the big screen, you still can at the time of writing. But if you'd like to watch it at home on your couch, that's now an option as well. The film has made over \$26 million at the Australian and New Zealand box office, so plenty of folks did head out to see it in theatres — and to see what happens to Diana Prince (Gadot) in the decade that gave us parachute pants. Chris Pine returns from the first Wonder Woman movie, while Kristen Wiig and Pedro Pascal join the franchise as new antagonists. Before the pandemic, a huge movie like Wonder Woman 1984 wouldn't ever be available to view at home so quickly. Usually, films that release in cinemas don't make the jump to home entertainment for 90 days, in fact. But much has changed about the world in the past year, with Wonder Woman 1984 following in the footsteps of a heap of fellow flicks that did the same last March and April, when cinemas closed. Other features, including Hamilton, Mulan and Soul, bypassed the big screen altogether last year, too. Whether this'll keep happening in the blockbuster space Down Under is vet to be seen — but there is a growing precedent for it in overseas countries where COVID-19 case numbers remain high and either all or most cinemas are closed. Warner Bros. the Hollywood studio behind Wonder Woman 1984, announced late last year that it'd be releasing both the superhero flick and its full 2021 slate of movies in cinemas and on HBO Max simultaneously where the latter is available. That doesn't include Australia and NZ, though, because HBO hasn't yett launched in either nation. I'm fine with noise (in a film like Blade Runner it's fine) but this one is very, very distracting. This does seem to be more "digital noise" looking than film grain. I found it to be exaggerated more on the 4K copy while making the 3D look a bit odd, so both discs had some issues with it. For whatever reason, the night shots seem to be cleaner than the daytime shots. The film itself is somewhat muted and does not seem to take as much advantage of the HDR as I was expecting. Night scenes look better in 4K due to the lower light levels and being able to get so many tones, and some highlights (such as her whip) stand out very nice. I felt that this movie would look much better than it did. Overall sharpness is somewhat low for a 4K release (this may be a mix of the heavy noise throughout and the fact that this was a 2K digital intermediate). Again, a title that I expected to really be the next "wow" title left a bit underhwhelmed. I felt that the 4K also made some of the CGI very noticeable and stand out.. even little odd things like water. The 3D version is also somewhat of a mixed bag. The digital noise again makes some scenes look odd, particularly since it's so noticeable with the separation of 3D. The film is noticeably dimmer (as most 3D titles tend to be) which make for some issues with the very dark night shots. Colors are again somewhat muted and the 3D focuses primarily on depth (going into the TV) rather than "in your face" moments. There are a few really good 3D shots (typically very quick ones where something is going towards the camera) but they're pretty far apart. The 3D is mixed, with some indoors shots looking great while some outdoor ones have very little separation. Some scenes I expected to be "wow'ed" by seemed very flat. Sound was very good (I don't have an atmos system to give a full review on that). I wish the video was as good!Lots of extras on both versions. Overall, for the picture quality of the 4K and 3D versions, I was left a little disappointed. I didn't see this one in the theaters but judging by the trailers I was expecting much more from the 3D/4K quality. The trailers available do not show the amount of grain/noise in the film itself; it's much more extreme when watching at home. In the end, what's the version to get? Really depends. The 4K is more distracting with the grain (and doesn't have the added sharpness you would expect) but does better at night and with some other highlights mixed in. A near perfect movie, Up to this point, I had watched all of the DCEU movies and have been entertained, but not particularly impressed. When I walked away from Batman V Superman, Wonder Woman was without a doubt the best part and I had hopes for her solo film. After Suicide Squad, my hopes were lessened, but still present. After seeing the film twice I can confidently say it is one of, if not the greatest super hero movies ever made. Wonder Woman is a very focused and purposeful superhero movie. There isn't a single scene that feels like filler and you can tell Patty Jenkins knows exactly what kind of story she wants to tell. The film balances action and adventure with social commentary very well and is almost flawlessly executed. The setting in 1918 puts us in a time when women were on the verge of revolution, and the presence of Diana clashing with patriarchal ideals is not only historically logical, but elevates the film to a modern allegory. It's one of those movies that follows superhero tropes and Joseph Campbell's heroes journey, but keep things fresh so it never once feels derivative. Gal Gadot is absolutely fantastic and gives one of most sincere superhero performances ever captured on film. She is able to communicate her characters thoughts and emotions without words, she has a powerful and commanding presence, she is elegant and intellectual, she is witty and clever. But at this point in her life she is also naive and does not understand the world as much as she thinks she does. You can see a clear distinction between the way she carries herself in Batman V Superman compared to Wonder Woman, further showcasing Gal Gadot's subtle and dedicated performance. In this movie, she is still relatively young and must learn a valuable lessons that mankind can be good and that evil does not come from only one source. A very powerful and inspiring message, especially in these troubled times. It was very smart to not cast an American actress or make Gal change her accent. She is a Greek Goddess and should not be a "girl next door" type. This is one of the most serendipitous casting decisions ever made, she was born to play Wonder Woman.
