## How to setup ge universal remote for vizio

Smartphones can do a lot of things these days. They give us turn-by-turn driving directions, show us the best places to eat nearby, check us in for a flight, and entertain us while we're waiting in line. But can we use them to turn on our TV or lower the volume on our stereo? The short answer: Yes. You'll need to download an app and purchase a few pieces of equipment, but using your phone as a universal remote is no longer a tech dream.TVs, DVD players, cable boxes and stereos use an infrared (IR) signal to know when to do things like change the channel or play the DVD. To convert your phone into a universal remote you'll need to purchase a device called an IR blaster that takes the commands you give on your phone and converts them into infrared signals. There are different devices that can do this, from pear-shaped orbs you sit on your table to covers that fit around your phone to adaptors you attach to the front of phone. Some IR blasters attach to your Internet router and capture signals from your phone and then transmit them to your TV, stereo or DVD player. Other devices send the signal directly from the equipment attached to your phone to the device you want to control. There are numerous apps available for download that work with the IR blasters to control electronic devices. Some just have basic functionality while others can be programmed to turn on multiple devices with just one tap of the screen. Some apps allow you to program which room in your home you can control so you can switch back and forth easily between devices. Other apps allow you to rate TV shows you're watching and make suggestions based on the shows you like. So download the apps, connect the blasters and change those channels like a real techie! Just keep in mind you won't be able to surf the channels when your phone conversation isn't as interesting as what's on TV. The remote makes use of "program codes" that must be entered into the remote to control the necessary devices. If you own one of these remotes, but do not have the included manual with the necessary codes, you must make use of the remote's "Code Search" function to control your devices. Turn on the device you wish to program. Make sure no other programmable devices are turned on. Press the "Code Search" button on your GE remote until the remote indicator is lit, then release the remote. Press the button for the device you wish to program. For example, if you wish to program your DVD player, press the "DVD" button. Press and release the "Power" button until your device turns off. Wait at least two seconds between presses of the power button. You may need to press the button up to 250 times before the device turns off. Press the "Enter" button once the device turns off to save the code in your remote. This article covers how to turn on your Vizio TV without a Vizio TV remote. All Vizio televisions have buttons on the TV itself, but they may be in hard-to-find places. You'll typically find the buttons on the back of the TV, in the bottom right, or bottom left corners. It varies from model to model, but once you find the power button, you'll always be able to turn on the television without a remote. In addition to a power button, you will also find volume, channel, and input buttons. The reason Vizio hides these buttons is twofold. The first concerns aesthetics—buttons clash with the sleek, minimalist design of most modern televisions. The second reason is the built-in buttons are not meant to be used for navigating menus. The included remote and smartphone app are both more efficient and convenient ways to control the television. The simplest way to turn on your television when you've lost or misplaced the remote is through the Vizio SmartCast app for iOS and Android. Locate and download the Vizio SmartCast app from either the Google Play store or the App Store, depending on your device. Download: Download: If this is your first time using the app, you'll need to pair it. Select Devices > Add in the upper-right corner. You'll be prompted to hold your phone near the device for a short time. Once paired, select Control at the bottom of the screen. Select Devices in the upper-right corner and choose your display from the list. Once selected, you can control the television as if your smartphone were a remote. Use it to turn the TV on or off, adjust the volume, change the channel, set the aspect ratio, and more. You don't have to open the app to turn on the television. If the TV is off, streaming anything from your smartphone to the TV will cause it to automatically turn on. If you're an avid gamer, you may want to streamline the process of jumping into a game. Here's how to make your television turn on just by starting up a game console. Connect your PlayStation 4 console to the Vizio television using an HDMI cable and start it up. Select Settings > System. Select Enable HDMI Device Link. When you turn on your PlayStation 4, the Vizio TV will automatically power on and switch to the correct input. In addition, selecting that input from the list will automatically turn on the PlayStation 4. The process is slightly different for Nintendo Switch users. Connect your Nintendo Switch console to the Vizio television via the dock. From the Home screen, select System Settings. Select TV Settings in the left column, and then scroll down the list and select Match TV Power State to turn it on. When you put your console to sleep, the input will switch off. When you power the console on, the TV will automatically switch to the proper input channel. Unfortunately for Xbox One players, there's no way to enable HDMI-CEC. While the Xbox can control the television, it does so through the use of an IR blaster and the Xbox Kinect, a peripheral item no longer produced by Microsoft. Why the console doesn't support this functionality is unclear, but fans have asked for it to be added since the Xbox's release. Thanks for letting us know! Tell us why!
