Identification Waltz's thinking against debates within realism in 1950, and the design in particular on its neglected foreign policy and democratic policy, this article claims that Waltz's thought contains in reality powerful national political dimensions that center on a defense of democratic foreign policies. Instead of marginalizing the internal politics, Waltz's theory and its criticism of classical realism is partly actually a subtle intervention in internal policy. Kenneth N. Waltz's Theory of international politics profoundly influenced international relations theory. The structural realism developed by Waltz claims that the anarchic system and the distribution of capacity are powerful constraints and incentives that produce sameness in the behavior of states. For Waltz, international relations is anarchic and non-hierarchical, populated by functionally similar units, and the structure of the international system or polarity varies according to the distribution of the abilities. The anarchic nature of the international system, and the hypotheses that states one to be minimal, seek their preservation and are socialized to imitate the other, allows Waltz to explain recurring international models and results, such as power balances, war preparation of several power distributions, and the recurrent Alliance training (1979: 118; for realist foreign policy theories, see the classical realism literature like Gulick 1955; Wolfers 1962 Morgenthau 1963 Tucicide 1982; and neoclassical realism including Friedberg 1988; Snyder 1991; Wohlforth 1993; Christensen 1996; Elman 1996; Rose 1998; Schweller 2006; Rathbun 2008; Lobell et al 2009). Waltz's structural realism influenced many of the main debates in the fields in the 1980s and 1990 including neoliberal institutionalism (Keohane 1984; OYE 1986; Baldwin 1993; Ruggie 1993); The Agenda (WENDT 1987; Dessler 1989) debate; the meaning of non-state actors (Krasner 1983); And more recently, the new international hierarchy studies (Lake 2003; 2009; Hobson and Sharman 2005), and the degenerative controversy research program (Vasquez 1997; LEGRO and MORAVCSIK 1999). Criticism and dissatisfaction for Waltz's structural realism (Ruggie 1983; Ashley 1986; Keohane 1986; Buzan et al 1993) fueled the constructivist, IDEANATIVE, and cultural research programs InnenPolitik (WENDT 1992; Goldstein and Keohane 1993; Rosecrance and Stein 1993; Katzenstein 1996; Adler and Barnett 1998; Guzzini 1998). Derived from the Waltz's structural realism, structural realist theorists can be divided into two competing versions with the hypotheses and competition policy requirements: offensive realism and defensive realism (for revisions of this literature see Lynn-Jones and Miller 1995; Frankel 1996; Miller 1996; Brooks 1997; Taliaferro 2000/01; James 2002; Walt 2002; Schweller 2003; Nexon 2009; the terms aggressive and a defensive realism originally appeared in Jack Snyder's myths of empire). A distinction between these two versions of realism is the role of the international anarchic system and if encourages states to maximize their safety or to maximize their power and influence. A second distinction is whether to conquer and pay expansion, and more generally, the cause of the pathological condition behavior including Overexpansion, selfencirclement and hyperextension. A final distinction is if the states are mainly revisionist their intentions, or Assume that they are, or if the states are mainly motivated to
